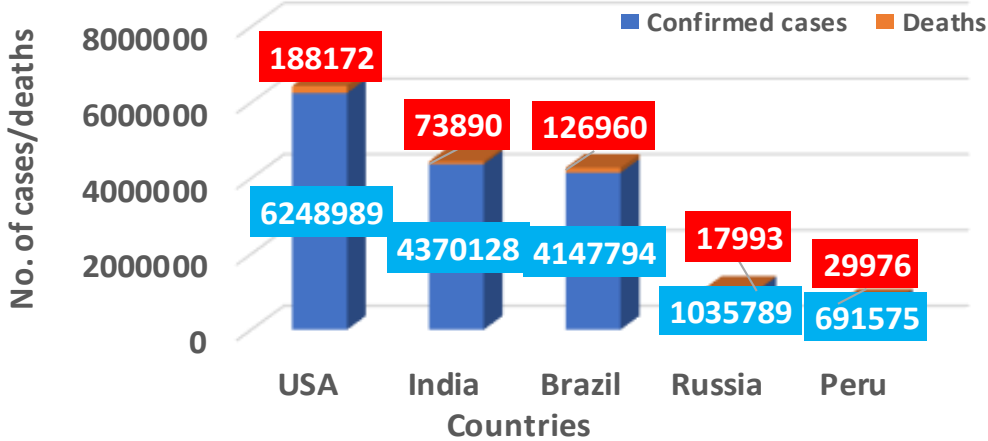

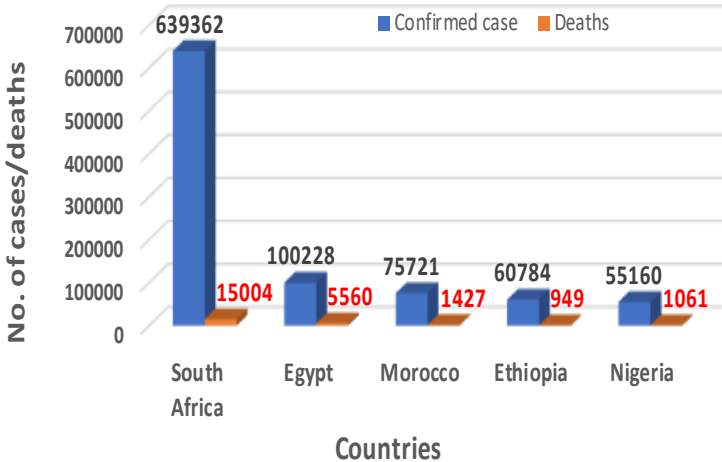

- A total of 3,666 new confirmed COVID-19 cases were reported from 24 countries compared to 3,578 cases reported from 32 countries the previous day (7 September 2020). Ethiopia reported the highest daily number of new cases, at 1,136 (31%), followed by South Africa with 1 079 (30%), Nigeria (296), Algeria (285), Kenya (151), Zambia (116), Zimbabwe (90), Mozambique (90), Madagascar (83) and Côte d'Ivoire (77).
- Fourteen new health worker infections were reported from Ethiopia (12) and Mozambique (2)
- A total of 41,936 (3.8%) health workers from 42 countries has been infected, with South Africa having 65% (27,360/41,540) of all the reported cases. Liberia 16% (208/1,311), Niger 16% (184/1,178) and Guinea-Bissau 12% (268/2,245), have the highest country specific proportion of health worker infections among confirmed cases

Fig. 3: Epidemiological details of confirmed COVID-19 cases in Ethiopia, 08-Sep 2020

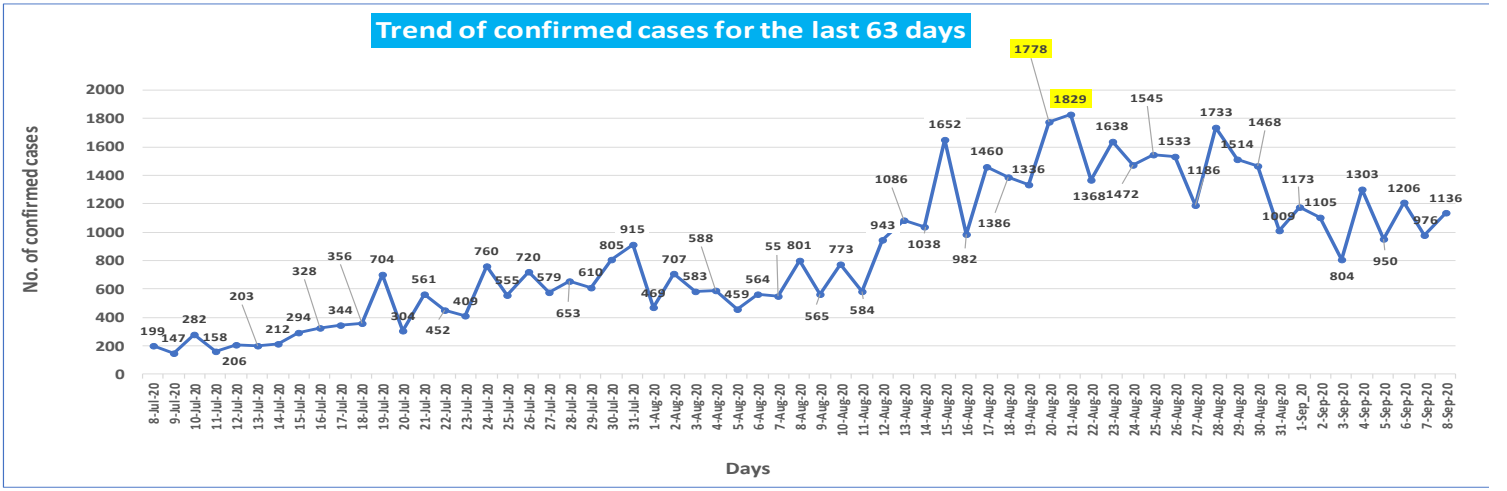


Fig. 4: Map indicating the distribution of confirmed COVID-19 cases in Ethiopia, 08-Sep 2020
