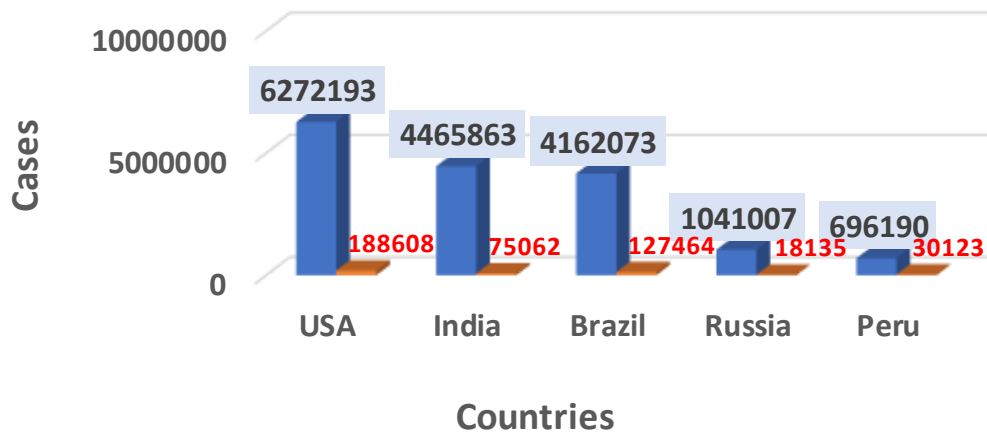

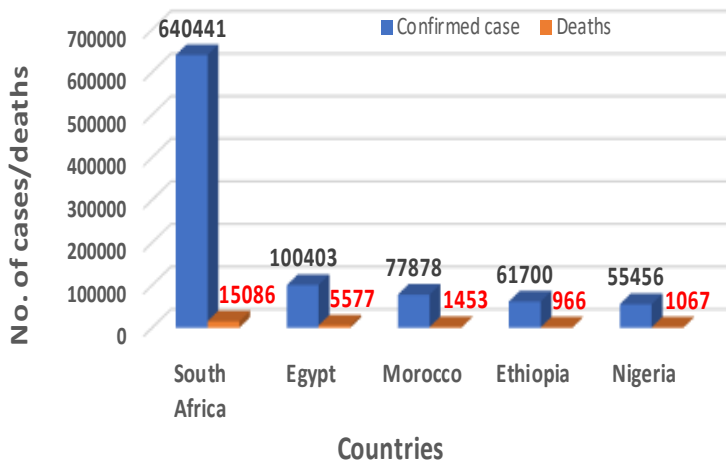

### AFRICA

Fig. 2: Five countries with the highest number of confirmed COVID-19 cases on the African continent; 09-Sep-2020



- Africa continues to observe a sustained decrease in reported cases and deaths especially South Africa reporting fewer cases, with an average daily case count of 800 cases just after Ethiopia with an average daily report of 1000 cases
- A total of 249 new health worker infections were recorded in the past 7 days from eight countries: Kenya (105), Uganda (52), Namibia (38), Mozambique (20), Ethiopia (12), Zambia (12), Eswatini (9), and Mauritania (1). South Africa retrospectively reported 1,519 health worker infections
- Twenty-six countries recorded a decrease in new cases in the last 7 days; those with a decrease of more than 50% include; Malawi (65%), Liberia (60%), Congo (60%), Zambia (54%), Rwanda (51%)

Fig. 3: Epidemiological details of confirmed COVID-19 cases in Ethiopia, 09-Sep 2020

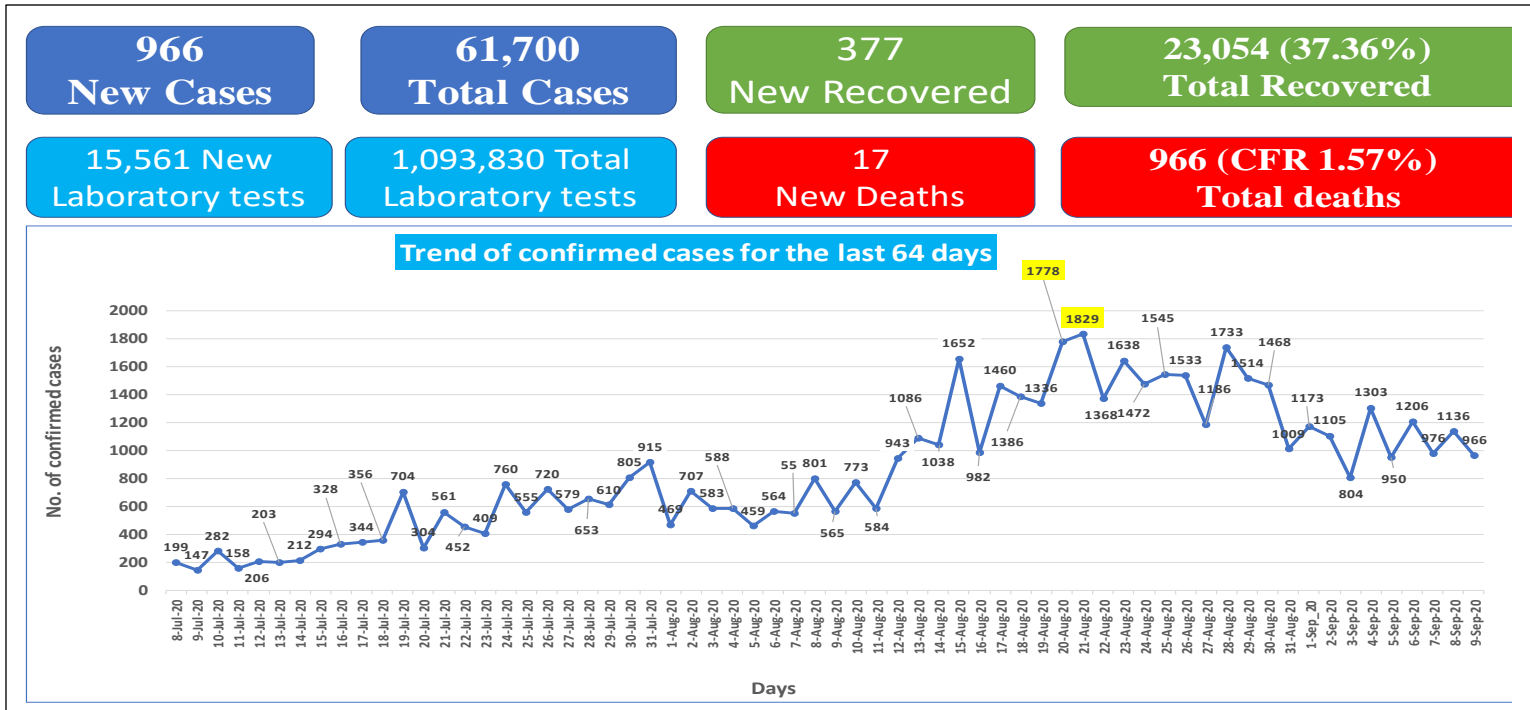


Fig. 4: Age and sex distribution of confirmed COVID-19 cases in Ethiopia, 09-Sep 2020
