#### WHO RESPONSE

- Coronavirus continues to spread across the world with more than 53 million confirmed cases and over 1.3 million deaths.
- The virus is surging in many regions and countries that had apparent success in suppressing initial outbreaks are also seeing infections rise again.
- The cases have risen over the past few months in several regions of the world and the rate of infection is still increasing especially in Europe and North America that are currently experiencing the steepest rise in new cases. The most recent figures show there were more than 650,000 new cases reported in last 24 hours
- In less than 3 weeks, cases increased from 40m to 50m
- Meanwhile, the US has recorded close to 11 million cases and is approaching 250,000 deaths from coronavirus, the highest figures in the world. However, US on the other hand has one of the highest test/1M population (502,676) compared to India that has reported the second highest number of coronavirus cases with the test/1M population of 90,132
- In Africa, there been a slight increase in Covid-19 infections over the past few weeks



### **AFRICA**

There was an average increase of 8% in new cases per week over the past month. In the week up to 8 November, new cases rose by 13% and new deaths rose by 18% relative to the previous week. Morocco, Libya, Tunisia, Cape Verde and Botswana are among the countries with the highest average number of new cases per capita
