



GLOBALY HIGHLIGHTS

- ◆ As of 24-March-2020, there were 413467 total confirmed cases and 18433 total deaths with a resultant increase of 10.9% and 13.6% respectively in the last 24 hours
- ♦ 175 countries/Regions are affected of which 49 are in Africa

"The virus is now spreading in countries with weak health systems, including some which are already facing humanitarian crises", "People and communities that are already uprooted due to conflict, displacement, the climate crisis or other disease outbreaks are the ones we must urgently prioritize".

In Africa, only 6 countries namely Botwana, Lesotho, Malawi, South Sudan, Sierra Leone and Western Sahara have not reported a single confirmed COVID-19 case.

A total of 2,758 confirmed cases and 83 deaths with a case fatality rate of 3.0%.
